



Dear Friends,



"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."

These words are the words of Jesus from our Gospel this weekend.

There are several striking elements in these profound words of Jesus for our reflection this week leading up to Palm Sunday. First, Jesus expresses aloud His human emotion, His state of mind. He is exhibiting a very natural human response to what He is preparing to do. This affirms to us His sharing in our humanity, in our human weaknesses. And yet, as Jesus goes on, rather than ask to be saved from His impending sacrificial death, He prays that the Father glorifies His own name. He surrenders His human will and life to the Father. In the light of that humble and total surrender, the Father affirms publicly His oneness with His Son, Jesus, and through Jesus, the Father makes Himself one with us.

Make no mistake about it, when the Father speaks of glory, He is talking about the glory which will flow from the suffering and torture of crucifixion. There's no way around that. Jesus enters into the very depths of human depravity, into the depths of human suffering, into the depths of every evil in order to overcome it all, to bring forth healing, to set free our fallen race so that we might live the very life of God Himself. We have received a gift far surpassing that of Adam and Eve in the Garden.

With Saint Patrick Day on Saturday and Saint Joseph Day on Monday, witnesses to the Faith surround this Sunday. The Foster-Father of Jesus and the Apostle to Ireland give testimony, both silent and spoken to the power of Jesus as Savior and Redeemer. They willingly reveal that Jesus is the One who draws all things to Himself, that the Cross is the sign of victory over this world, that we have no fear from the God who loves us so much and so tenderly, that He gave His only Son for us. Let us love Him in the same way that He loves us. Let us help each other to live passionately as disciples. And let us make disciples of all whom we meet along the way.

Please note that almost all of the (Arch)Dioceses in the US have the age of Confirmation in Grade 8 or higher. Many have it scheduled in High School. The excellent instructional and formational materials available are also geared to older students. We look forward to working with our families and young people in preparing them to receive this unique outpouring of the Holy Spirit and growth as disciples of Jesus Christ. Confirmation for those currently in Grade 5 will be celebrated in the Fall of 2020.

March 2018 Dear Parents,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

In Baptism, your child was claimed by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, became a child of God and a member of the Catholic Church. As he/she grew, he/she learned of the love of God in the "first school of faith, the family." As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states: The Christian home is the place where children receive the first proclamation of the faith. For this reason the family home is rightly called 'the domestic church,' a community of grace and prayer, a school of human virtues and of Christian charity" (No. 1666).

When your child became of school age, however, the Church provided religious instruction through the Parish Religious Education Program or Catholic School. This formation in faith includes sacramental preparation for First Penance, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. The primary object of this catechesis is to put your child into an intimate communion with Jesus Christ by knowing, loving and serving Him in this world to be happy with Him for all eternity. This education in conjunction with the domestic church, your home, is more than simply learning about Jesus; it is a spiritual formation which challenges your child to become a model of the faith and a disciple of Christ for his/her lifetime. The Sacrament of Confirmation gives grace for the spiritual journey.

Over the past two years, the Archdiocese conducted a study regarding the grades for Confirmation. Overwhelmingly, bishops, pastors, principals and directors of religious education noted there is a much better understanding and appreciation of the Sacrament of Confirmation by older grade school students.

Last June, after a presentation of the results of this study, the Council of Priests voted for the standard grade for the Sacrament of Confirmation to become grades 7 and/or 8 in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Over last summer, a consultation with the priests of the Archdiocese was conducted which supported the June decision and in September 2017 the Council of Priests again voted in favor of this change from the practice of Confirmation in grades 4, 5 or 6. In January, the Archbishop determined with the Council of Priests, that the new grades for the Sacrament of Confirmation are 7th and/or 8th grade.

The transition to this new practice begins in the 2018-2019 school year. Confirmation for our students, both Saint Eleanor and Sacred Heart, will be held in the Fall of 2020, for Grade 8 students. This will allow for catechesis and formation to take place in the school year of Grade 7.

As pastors, it is our desire for your child to be spiritually equipped to face the challenges of this world and bear witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are confident that this change, with your familial support, will allow for a deeper apprenticeship in the faith and stronger relationship with God for your child. It will help your child to become all God has created your child to be.



There are as many ways to pray as there are pray-ers in this world, but a few prayer methods can help us to spiritually prepare during Lent:

- I. Make your abstinence a prayer-in-action. As Catholics we are called to give something for something for Lent. Chocolate, coffee, that extra helping of dinner, one less hour of video games or watching DVDs—whatever it is, you can make what you're giving up for Lent a prayer as well: a prayer-in-action. Whenever you encounter the thing you are abstaining from or the time of day that you would normally enjoy it, take a moment to say a prayer in recognition of your wholeness in God even without the thing you have given up.
- **2.** Renew yourself through personal reflective prayer.-Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. One step you can take is to use the many free online resources to jump-start or reinvigorate your prayer life. Our Parish has a Daily Reflection online at www.steleanor.com/daily-lenten-reflection
- **3. Pray the Stations of the Cross.-** One of the most common traditions of Lent is to pray the Stations of the Cross. This prayer helps us reflect on the passion and death of Christ in preparation for Good Friday observance and the Easter celebration. Saint Eleanor Parish's Stations of the Cross are held on Wednesdays at 1:45pm & Fridays at 7:00 pm.
- **4. Reflect deeper on your liturgical prayer. -** When you attend Mass during Lent, be conscious of and meditate on the words you pray in the liturgy. For example, the Eucharistic Prayer, the highlight of each Mass, has special significance during Lent. After receiving communion, you may reflect more deeply on this great prayer of the Church.
- **5. Pray with children or as a family.** Being a parent, guardian, or teacher is a holy ministry and a sacred promise. Share your faith with children by letting them see and hear you pray, and by praying together. And don't forget about family dinners. Dinnertime is a great opportunity to start or enliven a tradition of family prayer during Lent.
- **6. Start a practice of daily prayer that will last after Lent. -** Perhaps the best prayer advice is to use Lent as a time to instill prayer habits that will last long after Lent has concluded.

So enjoy your Lenten prayer. And don't think you have to do all the above. Perhaps choose one or two of these prayer methods to concentrate on—and then you can more fully experience the pilgrim journey toward Easter that is Lent. (Courtesy of Loyola Press)
