





Happy Lent! That is not an oxymoron. Lent is certainly a time for repentance and conversion and personal sacrifices, things we sometimes try to avoid or put off, but we do any and all of these out of love and for love because Jesus is risen. We do them, so that our love can grow more abundant, more deeply and more fruitfully. Here we are at the Second Sunday of Lent

already. I pray that your Lenten journey towards Easter is going well. Once again this year, on the weekend of the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Friday/Saturday, March 9-10, at the suggestion of our Holy Father, Pope Francis at the conclusion of the Jubilee Year of Mercy, we will observe 24 HOURS FOR THE LORD.

It will be a time for adoration of our Lord in the Eucharist and for Confession. Our 24 HOURS FOR THE LORD will begin at 4 pm on Friday and continue until the 4:30 Vigil Mass on Saturday. This means that Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will not end with the Saturday morning Mass but continue throughout the day on Saturday. There will be a sign up poster in the narthex for our families and our people to sign up to spend some time with our Lord.

We will have additional confession times as well to accommodate our people. The additional times will be Friday evening after Stations of the Cross, 8-9 pm and Saturday, 11am – 1pm. The usual Saturday confession times will also be available. The *24 HOURS FOR THE LORD* will conclude with the 4:30 pm Vigil Mass.

This is a wonderful opportunity for our parish family. We are blessed with Eucharistic Adoration throughout the week but on March 10 we will have additional hours for all to come and spend a little extra time with our Lord. The additional confession times will hopefully be convenient for our folks. To encounter the Mercy of the Lord is not only to be forgiven but also to be healed!

Our second *Discovering Christ* series is drawing to its close. We will be hosting another in the near future. On Saturday of last weekend, the group enjoyed the blessings of a daylong retreat, here on campus. It was an opportunity to intensify growing closer to Jesus our Lord in the context of stepping aside from the usual daily commitments and to focus on their relationship with Jesus *and* His relationship with them. Continue to pray for these fellow parishioners as they come to the end of this series.

And, what a special weekend this was for our parish family and particularly for our young ones who made their First Penance. We held two celebrations due to the numbers of youngsters and families involved. It is such a wonderful blessing to see these little ones encounter the mercy of the Lord for the first time. They will soon be receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus in First Communion, May 5. Please keep them and their families in your good prayers also.

**Fasting** 

The bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is recommended.

#### Fasting-

- Fasting and abstinence unites us to the redemptive suffering and death of our Lord. "The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice."
- The practice of fasting: In the Latin Catholic Church, the penitential practice of fasting allows a person to eat one full meal each day. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal.

Beyond the fasting from food, there are traditions Catholics use during Lent.
