A WORD

FROM THE

The right to life is a precious right, the most precious right. Life is a gift ~ not from the state or the government, not from the medical profession, and not from the insurance industry. Life is God's gift! And, while human beings are intimately involved in the transmission of life, without God there is no life.

So fundamental and so foundational is the right to life that our founding Fathers enshrined it in the Declaration of Independence and it is found in the Constitution, despite the mind-boggling gymnastics of the Supreme Court in Roe v. Wade. What brings this precious right to mind is not the threats to life in the womb as fearsome as they are but the threats to the life of the sick, suffering and terminally ill in our culture. A few weeks ago, I came upon an opinion article in the Wall Street Journal by J.J. Hansen entitled, "I Want My Doctors To Help Me Live, Not Die." He writes concerning legally assisted suicide efforts and his own battle with deadly brain cancer at a young age. I encourage you to check it out yourself at ~ https://www.wsj.com/article_email/i-want-my-doctors-to-help-me-live-not-die-1499381064-lMyQjAxMTE3MDAwNzgwMTc3Wj/.

Mr. Hansen was in the prime of his life, living the American dream, married with a one-year-old child when the brain cancer hit. He is a US Marine veteran of Iraq. When multiple doctors said there was nothing that could be done, he dropped into despair but was helped through it by a supportive family. Knowing that medical prognoses cannot always be right, he decided that he would do whatever he could. He went onto regular and experimental therapies and three years later with another child born, he is living life.

He has dedicated himself to working against assisted suicide legislation around the country (29 states have introduced such legislation) and trying to promote the support and the making life comfortable for those with life threatening illnesses. If assisted suicide legislation becomes the norm, he believes that insurance companies and others will simply opt for the easy way out, the less expensive way rather than help patients live their lives. It is a very interesting article as he writes not from the moral or theological perspectives but from the all too human perspective. I believe he's right.

While we must resist the taking of any innocent human life from conception through natural death because life is a right and a gift, we must also work to assist and bring comfort to those who are suffering. It is not an either/or but a both/and. Our medical sciences have done and do so many marvelous things. They have powerful tools available to help as well as to comfort in life affirming ways those who are suffering. May we work together to protect all human life and to bring comfort, help and support to all who suffer.


