Dear Friends,

A WORD

PASTOR

Saint Paul tells us this weekend, "Brothers and sisters: For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery." Particularly poignant words for us this weekend as we prepare to celebrate our Nation's birthday, Independence Day,

the fourth of July. I guess in many ways the outdoor festivities of parades, grilling and partying along with nighttime fireworks overshadow the reality of July 4, 1776.

It's important I think that we re-visit the words of that Declaration of Independence which are rooted in a belief in God and in the God-given rights of us all. "...We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. — That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed..." What our founding fathers set forth upon, was not capricious and not self-serving in an individualistic way. They sought to establish a new order so that our citizens might have life, liberty and pursue happiness.

Saint Paul focuses such pursuit into its most essential dimension. Real happiness does not come from slavery, that is, darkness, evil, sin. Abiding happiness endures only when it is conformed to the Will of God, which is where we find freedom itself. Now in our world, society and country, there is much confusion about happiness and freedom. Even our technology is not able to answer the deepest longings of our hearts. Power, prestige, position, wealth, possessions are all very attractive and alluring. But all of these and all the things surrounding us in this world will pass away, come to an end. What will be left?

Jesus indicates that it is not easy to embrace truth, freedom, real happiness. "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." "...Follow me." "...Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." "...No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." If we are to be true children of God, if we are to be passionately disciples of Jesus, if we are to discover all that God has made us for ~ there is only one way for us ~ embracing the Cross of Christ, offering ourselves selflessly for others, lifting up our sacrifices every day to our heavenly Father.

May we, and all our fellow citizens, draw back from all that attracts and yet does not satisfy. May we recommit our selves to the self-evident truths that come from God Himself. May we let go of personal pursuits of pleasure so as to build up God's kingdom here, establishing new found ways for peace, hope and joy, defending the most vulnerable among us from conception to natural death. For in the end, the only inheritance we have is that which comes from God and which we return to Him.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I enthusiastically welcome your support of our annual archdiocesan collection for the **Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD)**, which will soon commemorate 50 years of concretely demonstrating the Church's solidarity with disadvantaged members of our communities.

In Philadelphia and other urban areas in our region, there is a growing gap between those who are financially secure and those who are not, including middle class families as well as the poor. U.S. Census data in 2018 show that Philadelphia's poverty rate has remained at 26% since 2013, while the national average is half that, ranking Philadelphia as the poorest of the country's 10 major cities. The median income in our four suburban counties is double that of families in Philadelphia, where many households have incomes below \$18,450 for a family of three, and nearly all of those households include children, the frail elderly, and the disabled. Nearly one in four Philadelphia residents suffers from food insecurity. These brothers and sisters of ours are victims of what some have called "an unnatural disaster" that is both preventable and able to be rectified by the collective efforts of

those who care to make a difference.

Across our country today, more than 46 million people are living in poverty, and one third of that number are children. Their challenges stem from a cycle of systemic poverty that often prevents them from realizing their God-given promise and vocation in life. While some people's situations may have resulted from their own poor decisions, the majority have simply not had the opportunities or the blessings of support and good example to achieve economic security or household stability.

Keep in mind that vast majority of the poor want a better future for themselves, and most especially for their children. As Catholics we are called to stand with them and be their advocates as they strive to achieve living conditions worthy of their God-given human dignity. That is why your support of CCHD is so vital, providing funding for local community organizations that work with those living on the margins to facilitate their own efforts to overcome the causes of their poverty. Pope Francis called our attention to the struggles of the poor in his message for the second World Day of the Poor: "God's salvation is a hand held out to the poor, a hand that welcomes, protects and enables them to experience the friendship they need....Each individual Christian and every community is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully part of society. This demands that we be docile and attentive to the cry of the poor and to come to their aid." The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops holds an annual CCHD collection to give us a way to be a hand of friendship held out to the poor. In the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, the CCHD collection will occur at Masses on the weekend of July 6-7. Your contribution can help your neighbors to finally break free of poverty and achieve a better future for themselves and their families. May God bless you for your generous response to this year's CCHD appeal.
