**IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND DIRECTION
ABOUT ATTENDING MASS IN THE MIDST OF THE PANDEMIC
SAINT ELEANOR CATHOLIC CHURCH
COLLEGEVILLE**

We rejoice as we continue to welcome back more and more of our Parish Family week by week. **Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus as we celebrate together in-person the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.**

We continue to do our part to ensure a peaceful and safe experience for all in these times. The CDC, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and the Archdiocese have *announced new guidelines for the present and for beginning May 31*. **We have updated information here in light of those guidelines.** It is good to know that the Archdiocese has shared that “there has not been a known traceable instance of contracting COVID-19 through the reception Holy Communion in the entire country.”

GENERAL POINTS

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as of Monday, May 31, 2021, lifts all building sanitation, distancing, and capacity restrictions. All parishes and institutions in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery Counties are free to lift all building sanitation, distancing and capacity restrictions on Monday, May 31, 2021. For Philadelphia it is June 11. You will notice that beginning May 31 the blue painters’ tape will be gone as well as the floor decals. Hand sanitizers will still be available for your personal use.

The Faithful continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation until further notice. While you are **not** required to attend Mass in person at this time, *if you are healthy and with no underlying condition or other circumstance, we encourage your in-person participation at Holy Mass. There really is no substitute.* However,

please stay home ~ if you are sick, feel ill or have a fever;

please stay home ~ if you are at higher risk of severe illness with COVID19. If you are uncertain about your risk status, please consult your doctor, and also check the CDC guidelines.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass continues to be available to all **via live stream**. Our **10:30 AM** Sunday Mass is live streamed weekly. You will be able to find it on our website, our YouTube channel, our Facebook page. Once it is aired, it remains available on those various platforms.

For the spiritual and pastoral benefit of the faithful, several weeks notice will be provided as to when the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation will be reinstated by the Archbishop. Even when the obligation is restored, the faithful, *as always*, are excused legitimately from the obligation when they are seriously sick or caring for someone who is.

PARKING & ENTERING CHURCH

All parking areas are open for use. If parking in the back, large lot, please enter Church through the back Narthex doors. For now, we continue to use one way into Church – the **front and back** doors into the Narthex. For leaving Church at the end of Mass, feel free to leave by any of the Church doors.

Hand sanitizers are available at the Church entrances. We encourage you to use these when entering and exiting Church. As you enter the Church, you will be able to pick up a Worship Aid (which will be included in the Parish Bulletin) to use during Mass and then to take home with you. Please do not leave it in Church.

Also, as you enter the doors into our main Church, there is a basket to accept your Sunday donation envelopes for the Parish as well as for any other collections. *All envelopes for any weekend or even second collections can be placed together in this same basket.* We are not taking up a physical collection during the Offertory of the Mass at this time.

THE USE OF FACE COVERINGS AND MASKS

We are following the guidance of the CDC:

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) issued new guidance on the use of face coverings and masks as of Thursday, May 13, 2021. According to this guidance, people who are fully vaccinated against the coronavirus no longer need to wear masks or follow social distancing restrictions in most indoor and outdoor settings, except as required by state and local laws or other regulations. Pennsylvania accepted the CDC guidelines immediately. Therefore, our parishioners and visitors can freely comply with the relaxed measures with regard to face coverings/masks for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy.

The CDC guidance on the use of face coverings and masks does not allow for an easy observance since they apply differently to different groups of people at the same time— those fully vaccinated and those not vaccinated.

Those who are not fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to wear a face covering or a mask in the nave. If a face covering or mask is worn, it is to be removed before the reception of the Body of Christ at the Communion of the Mass.

At this time, we need to be guided by the principle that people are to be respectful of a person's choice not to wear or to wear a face covering or mask in churches in the Archdiocese.

SEATING

As of May 31, you may take any seat in any pew as we are no longer required to observe social distancing or restrictions on capacity. We do ask everyone to be respectful of those who may wish some spacing while in Church. We have a team of helpers, our Ambassadors, to welcome and greet you as well as to answer any questions you may have.

DURING THE CELEBRATION OF MASS

Missalettes are not available. You are welcome to bring your own missal/readings with you. A WORSHIP AID (*included in the Parish Bulletin*) is available both on-line and for pick up when coming into Church. When leaving, please take this with you.

Presently, there is a cantor and organist at all the Masses. Singing is allowed and encouraged.

As noted above, there is no collection taken up during the Offertory of Mass. Please place your collection envelope into the marked basket as you enter the Church.

There is no Sign of Peace during Mass and the Precious Blood is not distributed.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

The faithful may receive Holy Communion in the hand or on the tongue. We will end the special line for those receiving Holy Communion on the tongue. Please come forward in any Communion line as before in the usual fashion. Those who receive a low-gluten Host are asked to continue to come to the center aisle and up to the Sanctuary where the priest or deacon with the small pyx will be sure that you receive Holy Communion.

When you near the Communion Minister, if you are wearing a mask, please remove your mask. Once the Host has been placed onto your hand or tongue, please move to the side a few feet to receive Our Blessed Lord and replace your mask to return to your pew.

EXITING THE CHURCH

At the conclusion of Mass, please exit the Church through any of the Church doors. Please take the parish bulletin/ worship aid home with you.

FINAL THOUGHTS

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

In the midst of this Memorial Day weekend, as we remember, honor, and pray for all those who made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our country, we celebrate the great solemn feast of the Most Holy Trinity. We acknowledge in Faith what God has revealed about Himself that He is One God, Three Divine Persons ~ Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Our Gospel this weekend comes from the end of Saint Matthew, the great commission from Jesus: *"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."*

We hear echoes of this great commission every time we recite our parish prayer. While baptizing ordinarily is the role of deacons, priests, and bishops, the exception being an emergency situation, making disciples is entrusted to each and every one of us with no exceptions. So, the questions we should ask ourselves on a regular basis are ~ how many times have I given witness to my faith in Jesus, or told someone what Jesus has done for me, or when asked to remember a prayer intention taken that very moment and prayed with the person. Now to many Catholic folks that all may sound a bit out of the ordinary. But how else are we going to make disciples unless we talk about Jesus and share Jesus in our ordinary moments of life with others?

At this point let me recommend a very remarkable book, very short ~ 60 pages. It is entitled, *Making Missionary Disciples*, by Curtis Martin. Many of our staff have read it and our Envisioning Team members have read it as well. It is a great insight into living out our discipleship, modeled on Jesus' own life.

It is not helpful to lament the numbers of people leaving the practice of the Faith, or the numbers who no longer attend Sunday Mass, or those pushing secular agendas and worse. We are in a battle, truly a fierce spiritual battle in this world. There is a breach, which the forces of evil try to manipulate. But we, by God's free grace, are His living temples. The Holy Spirit enflames us, prepares us, and equips us for this struggle as we surrender our minds, hearts, and wills to Jesus Christ, our Lord.

So let us not grow faint of heart, overcome by the worries, anxieties, and fears of the world around us. Let us seek and accept God's grace every day, and in every moment, for by His grace we will meet the challenges of this life with His power, wisdom, and light.

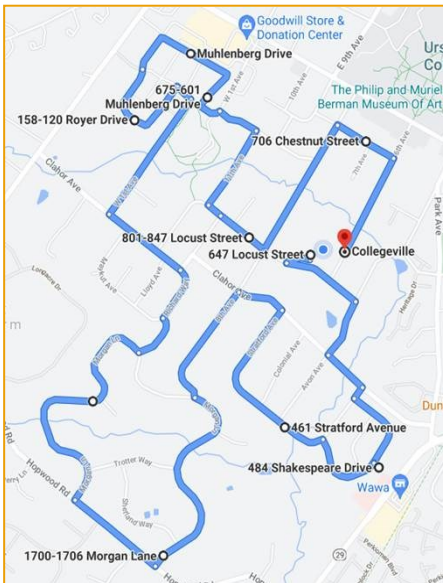

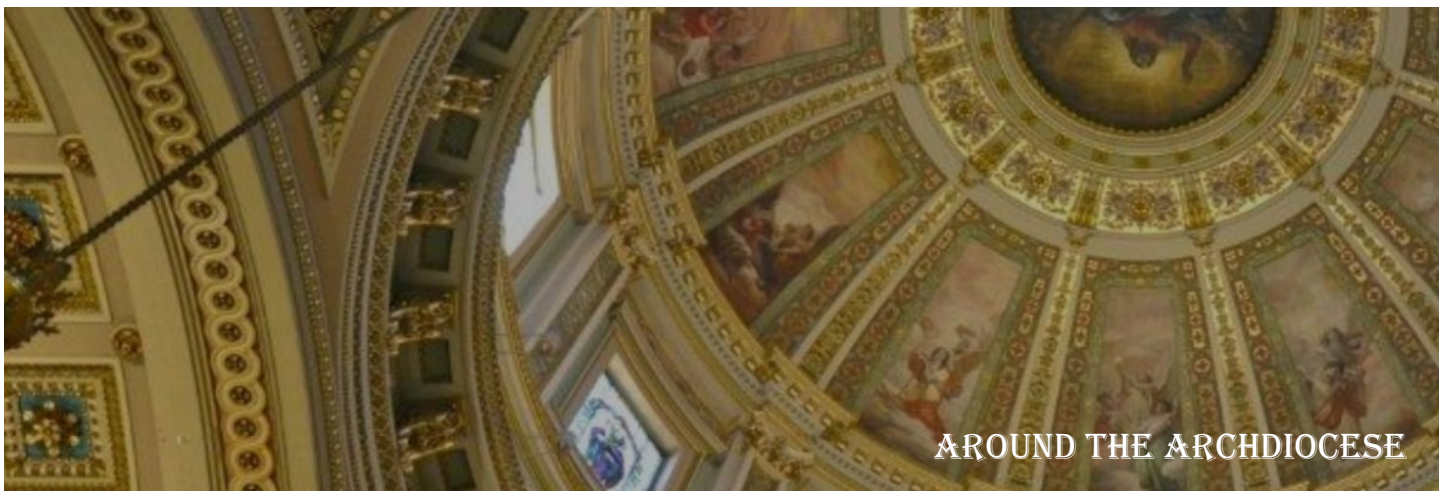
