# Jubilee Year of Mercy -The Church of Mercy



"...a soldier thrust his lance into His side, and immediately blood and water flowed out." –Jn 19:34 Throughout the ages, the Church has understood this moment in the life of Christ as the birth of the Church. St. John Chrysostom (4th cent.) explains, "Water and blood symbol-

ized Baptism and the holy Eucharist. From these two sacraments the Church is born." At the same time, we see in the blood and water flowing from the pierced heart of Jesus a perfect symbol of God's infinite mercy.

In this scene of Jesus' heart being pierced for us, we find simultaneously a revelation of the Church's sacraments and a revelation of Divine Mercy. The fact that *mercy* and *sacrament* are revealed in the same moment allows us to understand that sacraments are encounters with God's tender mercy.

The Holy Year is a good time to consider how much we actually experience this truth. Many times we approach the sacraments out of routine, not really knowing why we are receiving them and not really sensing that they have any effect in our lives. But if the sacraments truly flow from the merciful heart of Jesus Christ, then our reception of the sacraments should be – *each time*! - a deeply transformative moment.

Let us spend this time of grace asking God to unlock the power of the sacraments for us so that we experience them as they truly are, an encounter with the jaw-dropping, life-changing merciful love of God's Heart. –Meghan Cokeley, Office for the New Evangelization, Archdiocese of Philadelphia

## How to Live It

During the Year of Mercy, ask God for the grace to experience the sacraments as they truly are. Make an effort to be more open and attentive each time you receive Holy Communion or go to Confession. Study the Church's beautiful teachings on the sacraments. Work on removing from your life the sin that might be "clogging up" your ability to receive the effects of the sacraments.

God says to you, Do not be afraid of holiness; do not be afraid to aim high, to let yourself be loved and purified by God; do not be afraid to let yourself be guided by the Holy Spirit. CYO DANCES: SE CYO sponsors monthly dances throughout the school year. These dances are open to 6th through 8th grade boys and girls in our local community. To enter the dance, the student must have a Dance Pass. Parish children have the choice of ordering an Annual Dance Pass or a Single Dance Pass. Children who are not members of St. Eleanor Parish must purchase a Single Dance Pass online prior to the dance and bring proper ID to enter the dances. Current school year ID's are considered proper ID. ID's from the previous school year, library cards, YMCA cards, report cards, etc. are not considered proper ID and cannot be used to gain admittance. To be admitted into the dance, you must have purchased either an Annual Dance Pass or a Single Dance Pass on line. The dances are chaperoned by parents of our CYO teams and programs. The doors open at 7 PM and the dancing ends at 10 PM sharp. Once inside, a child cannot leave without a parent before 10 PM. When dropping off your child please ensure your child has entered the dance before you depart. Please remember that there will be no dance tickets sold at the door. You must have a pre-purchased Dance Pass to enter the dance. There is a standard dress code for the dance and guidelines for parents to assist in chaperoning. Annual Dance Passes Will Be For Purchase: Cost \$35 and will admit you into all 7 dances. Individual Dance Pass: Cost \$7- per dance. ## TABERNACLE & SANCTUARY RESTORATION

Here is a synopsis of the income and expenses related to the work undertaken in our Sanctuary...

Donations to Date: \$134,682.75 Expenses: \$127,610.14

The final aspect of the original proposals shared with our parishioners in July 2015 is the expansion and renovation of the two Sacristies behind the Main Altar. The original estimate for this work was approximately \$38,000.

We currently have \$7,072.61 towards that project. We are grateful for those who continue to make donations through the use of the special gold envelopes. The Sacristies are the "work rooms" where the liturgical items are stored and prepared for use at Mass and all Church services. Additional space and storage are very much needed for efficiency and organizing those who serve our liturgies.
