FROM THE

Each week as the concluding prayer for our General Intercessions (Prayer of the Faithful), we recite to-PAST()R gether our parish prayer praying to be an Amazing Parish. I have said before that Saint Eleanor is an

amazing parish. We see it in so many ways: in the friendliness of our people, in the commitment to Faith and the Sacraments, in the willingness to step out and to help out, in the generosity to various "drives" to assist those in need, in the large and varied numbers of ministries and programs available, in the hours of service given by our parishioners both young and old, in the parish commitment to our *Tithing the Tithe*, in the inspiring desire of our people to be disciples of the Lord Jesus.

Of course, this does not mean that we, individually or collectively, have reached perfection. We are striving towards perfection, to being "perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt 5:48). It is interesting that Saint Luke uses the word merciful rather than perfect, which indicates what kind of perfection is required of us.

So, as we strive to be *more amazing*, both individually and collectively, the cornerstone is prayer! The parish prayer, personal prayer, daily prayer. We pray to grow more passionately as disciples, to be set on fire, to unite in worship, to proclaim God's word, to celebrate reverently and passionately the Eucharist, to draw people to God. Without God's grace and power, none of this is possible. As we pray fervently, we open ourselves up to God's grace and power, which impels us to help one another and others to be intentionally disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ! May we never grow weary of praying, trusting in the fact that God's grace and power can do so much more than we think or imagine possible.

On another note, our Archbishop writes a weekly column on varied topics. I was perusing some of the recent ones and the topics are diverse ~ The Importance of Humane Vitae; Piety and Patriotism; Sympathy for the Devil; Hard cases make bad law, bad law makes hard cases; and Mary, the Mother of God, the Humble and the Sane. There are a lot of voices out there trying to get our attention about every human whim imaginable. I trust and pray that you are reading good Catholic sources to gain insight and to overcome the confusion that surrounds us. Not just the Archbishop but websites like Bishop Robert Barron and his Word on Fire (<u>www.wordonfire.org</u>); The Catholic Thing (www.thecatholicthing.org); The National Catholic Register (www.ncregister.com); and so many others...

Perhaps in these summer months, you can check some of these out to find strength in our Catholic Faith so as to navigate the confusion of the world and to bring the light of Christ to everyone, everywhere.

The **Divine Mercy** theme for June is: "Thanks." This month is divided into two parts: the first part is "Thanks to God;" the second part is "Glorifying God."




