Last weekend, I wrote about our Amazing Parish and our prayer to become even more amazing. PAST()R Praying is essential and, of course, not restricted to Mass when we say the prayer for the parish. When

we pray alone and pray with others, day by day, may we ever keep our parish and one another in the forefront our prayers.

A focus we have had now for some time is how to enhance our Sunday Worship Experience. The weekend is when we see 99% of those parishioners who are committed to the Faith by their regular attendance at Mass. While we know that the percent of those Catholics who attend Mass regularly has declined significantly, those who do come regularly are a primary focus of our efforts in building an environment to nurture intentional disciples as they walk with the Lord Jesus.

We have many who are dedicated to this ministry already (thank you). We have several people who have expressed interest in serving. And now, we are ready with a vision and will seek an opportunity to train those serving in this ministry going forward.

I hosted a meeting of our Ushers a few weeks back. It was a fruitful meeting and exchange. I shared with them a vision of their work, which is not a "job" but a real ministry. They will begin to wear identifiable signs so that the congregation will know who they are and who to turn to in the case of a need inside Church.

We are blessed with the assistance of so many of our young who serve faithfully as Altar Servers and of our Sacristans and Assistant Sacristans who keep the entrances and Church in good shape throughout our many Masses and who set up and clean up between Masses.

The wonderful ingredient that blesses our weekend experiences is the friendliness of our people in reaching out to one another, which I mentioned last weekend. This weekend, I am inviting YOU, each of you, to consider taking on a ministry role in order to live out your discipleship more intentionally. You are already coming to Church, you already know Jesus as your Lord and Savior. Now we need you to witness that Faith to our parish family by your participation and help in one of our many weekend ministries. You'll be glad you stepped up. And our parish will continue to grow in amazing ways in worship, community and faith.
