A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This is the next-to-last Sunday in Ordinary Time. Next weekend, we celebrate the great solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is not surprising then that the Church presents Scripture readings to us that invite us to examine the things of the end times.

You know, life and death, heaven and hell. It is an invitation to ponder again the questions which well up within every human being ~ who am I, where did I come from, where am I going?

For disciples of Jesus Christ, we find the answers to such human longings in our Lord, most especially in His Passion and Death on the Cross and His Resurrection. By His power and grace, we are able to make a difference in this world. Not only are we transformed by His grace but His grace within us helps us to bring transformation into our world. All we must do is follow Him with complete surrender and serenity, doing what He does. May each of us open ourselves more intensely to His grace so that His work may be accomplished within us and through us!

If you had the opportunity to come to the parish campus over the last two weeks, you may have noticed that we have been having a lot of tree service done. Approximately nine trees have had to be removed and many more have had to be trimmed back or dead branches removed. We wanted to be sure that this was accomplished before the snow and ice begins to show up. Of course, it is a very costly project into the thousands of dollars but it will help keep our trees and property in the best condition. We will also have at least five trees planted come Spring. Four in the parking lot near the front doors of the Church where we had to remove trees and one behind the Chapel where another pine tree had died.

Our gardening angels have done a truly wonderful job throughout the summer and now the fall months keeping flowers blooming in the various flower pots near the entrances of Church and the parish offices. Recently two other "angels" planted somewhere around 700 tulip bulbs around the church, the parish offices and the parish house. Next spring should look truly beautiful with so much color.

I believe that our new marble statues of Our Lady and Saint Joseph will arrive on November 15. We will still need to construct the appropriate pedestals for them in the Sanctuary. I was told they weigh near 800 pounds each. Someone has already committed to donating the statue of Our Lady and I believe there are some people interested in Saint Joseph. One of the 3 red stoles also is being donated. The other two are still available as memorials. Once I have a design and pricing on the two marble pedestals for the statues, they also will be available as memorials.

Over the last few weeks, we have collected toiletry items for the needy and clothing for Saint Vincent DePaul Society. Thank you, one and all, for your care and concern for our brothers and sisters in need. Your generous response will be remembered by our gracious and loving Father God!

We recently made the final donations from the *Tithing* the Tithe funds for last fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. Information will be published here shortly on those who received the donations. The *Tithing the Tithe* Committee will soon get to work on reviewing requests and the funds available for this fiscal year. As you know 3% of our ordinary Sunday collections is being set aside for this purpose this year. This is up from 1% last year. The Tithing the Tithe program allows us as a parish family, relying on God's generosity, to gratefully give something back to help those who accomplish the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy. Your generosity and goodness in supporting our parish efforts in ministry, programs, pastoral initiatives and tithing is deeply appreciated!!

This weekend we welcome our Seminarian, Austin Chukinas, at all the weekend Masses as he speaks about the annual Seminary Appeal. Did you know we were among the top ten donating parishes to last year's appeal?

Congratulations to all of you for your kind generosity!!

Thanksgiving is coming quickly. We have a 9 am Mass on Thanksgiving morning at which we bless fresh bread for everyone to take home to your Thanksgiving tables. What a wonderful way to begin this national holiday, at Holy Mass giving thanks to God, the giver of every good gift. Hope to see vou there!

Jubilee Year of Mercy -God the Father, Rich in Mercy

The director of the Christian rehab facility was explaining its approach. "Around here we don't talk about God the Father," he said. "Fathers have too bad a reputation. Instead of loving their families well, many have deserted their families, or are abusive, "Father"

brings up bad memories. So it's all about Jesus for months until they're ready to hear."

What a tragedy! As many others can attest, fathers who live up to their calling—even if they're not perfect help us to see the face of our heavenly Father. The best fathers, by mirroring God's love to their children, are faithful, kind and merciful. But even when they're not, God the Father is all of these things. He is love, and there's no end to his mercy.

What does that mean? When God revealed himself to Moses at the burning bush, he didn't just say, "I AM.' He began to explain: "I have seen" the afflictions of my people, he said. "I have heard" their cry. "I know" their sufferings, and "I have come down" to deliver them. That is mercy! In Latin, misericordia: "miserable heart." Fr. George Kosicki, CSB, describes it as "having a pain in your heart for the pains of another, and taking pains to do something about their pain." God is the same today. He sees our need, he hears our cries, he knows our sufferings, and he has come down to deliver us. His mercy never ends.

So many people have "father wounds." We long for someone to see and hear and know us -- and love us unconditionally. Our own fathers may fall short, but God does not fall short! He is the ultimate Father. And because he is who he is, because he lavishes his mercy on us, we can be merciful too. -Sarah Christmyer, St. Norbert Parish, Paoli, Catholic author and speaker
