Dear Friends,

With today's Gospel, we begin the wonderfully deep and revealing five-week journey through Chapter 6 of Saint John's Gospel ~ Jesus' *Bread of Life* discourse, which follows the miraculous multiplication of loaves, our Gospel reading this weekend. In this discourse, the

Bread of Life is first used by Jesus "as a figure for the revelation of God in Jesus and then for the Eucharist."

This miracle of the multiplication of loaves is the only miracle found in all four Gospels, two occurrences each in Matthew and Mark. It obviously impacted the early disciples. It not only highlights Jesus' divine powers but the overwhelming abundance of leftovers indicates the extreme abundance of God's care and compassion for us, His children.

It is because of the Father's overwhelming generosity and compassion in sending His only Son, Jesus, whose suffering, dying and rising won our salvation, that Saint Paul encourages us "to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace..."

When we come to receive Holy Communion, what are we doing? What is going on within our minds, hearts and souls? Hopefully, we come to Communion fully conscious of this most awesome and precious moment of Holy Mass. We are not just following the crowd. We are approaching Jesus Christ who is coming to us humbly as food and drink. This is the Food of the Last Supper, the Food of the Banquet of Life. This is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ Himself, strengthening us to be fully alive disciples of His Mystical Body here on earth.

This is proof-positive that God is never out done in generosity. He comes to us. He makes Himself available to us. He gives us grace upon grace to follow in His steps and to share His love with our brothers and sisters.

May this journey today and over the next four Sundays through Chapter 6 of John's Gospel, allow us to draw more deeply into union with Jesus and by our surrender to His grace with one another. As Saint Paul reminds us there is, "one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."
