do so much throughout the year not only for our parish family but for our brothers and sisters in need. We are very grateful for their enthusiasm and presence among us. We thank Matt Kirsch for his warm and caring leadership of our Youth Ministry programs.

We had a wonderful Christmas Tree Lighting and Blessing back on the Monday before Thanksgiving. We picked that evening to avoid conflicting with other local tree lighting events. We sang some carols, we prayed, we blessed the tree, and the Chetta Family helped turn the tree lights on. The weather was cooperative and there were wonderful home-made cookies and hot chocolate for all. It was a most enjoyable moment in the life of our parish family. Perhaps you noticed, we added a star atop the tree. May the lights of the tree remind us of Christ, our Lord, the Light of the world.

We have come to the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday with its rose color vestments and Advent candle.
