THE LITURGY of the WORD

FIRST READING:

EX 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this

reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.





**IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND DIRECTION
ABOUT ATTENDING MASS IN THE MIDST OF THE PANDEMIC
SAINT ELEANOR CATHOLIC CHURCH
COLLEGEVILLE**

We rejoice as we continue to welcome back more and more of our Parish Family week by week. **Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus as we celebrate together in-person the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.**

We continue to do our part to ensure a peaceful and safe experience for all in these times. The CDC, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and the Archdiocese have *announced new guidelines for the present and for beginning May 31. We have updated information here in light of those guidelines.* It is good to know that the Archdiocese has shared that “there has not been a known traceable instance of contracting COVID-19 through the reception Holy Communion in the entire country.”

GENERAL POINTS

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as of Monday, May 31, 2021, lifts all building sanitation, distancing, and capacity restrictions. All parishes and institutions in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery Counties are free to lift all building sanitation, distancing and capacity restrictions on Monday, May 31, 2021. For Philadelphia it is June 11. You will notice that beginning May 31 the blue painters’ tape will be gone as well as the floor decals. Hand sanitizers will still be available for your personal use.

The Faithful continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation until further notice. While you are **not** required to attend Mass in person at this time, *if you are healthy and with no underlying condition or other circumstance, we encourage your in-person participation at Holy Mass. There really is no substitute.* However,

please stay home ~ if you are sick, feel ill or have a fever;

please stay home ~ if you are at higher risk of severe illness with COVID19. If you are uncertain about your risk status, please consult your doctor, and also check the CDC guidelines.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass continues to be available to all **via live stream**. Our **10:30 AM** Sunday Mass is live streamed weekly. You will be able to find it on our website, our YouTube channel, our Facebook page. Once it is aired, it remains available on those various platforms.

For the spiritual and pastoral benefit of the faithful, several weeks notice will be provided as to when the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation will be reinstated by the Archbishop. Even when the obligation is restored, the faithful, *as always*, are excused legitimately from the obligation when they are seriously sick or caring for someone who is.

PARKING & ENTERING CHURCH

All parking areas are open for use. If parking in the back, large lot, please enter Church through the back Narthex doors. For now, we continue to use one way into Church – the **front and back** doors into the Narthex. For leaving Church at the end of Mass, feel free to leave by any of the Church doors.

Hand sanitizers are available at the Church entrances. We encourage you to use these when entering and exiting Church. As you enter the Church, you will be able to pick up a Worship Aid (which will be included in the Parish Bulletin) to use during Mass and then to take home with you. Please do not leave it in Church.

Also, as you enter the doors into our main Church, there is a basket to accept your Sunday donation envelopes for the Parish as well as for any other collections. *All envelopes for any weekend or even second collections can be placed together in this same basket.* We are not taking up a physical collection during the Offertory of the Mass at this time.

THE USE OF FACE COVERINGS AND MASKS

We are following the guidance of the CDC:

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) issued new guidance on the use of face coverings and masks as of Thursday, May 13, 2021. According to this guidance, people who are fully vaccinated against the coronavirus no longer need to wear masks or follow social distancing restrictions in most indoor and outdoor settings, except as required by state and local laws or other regulations. Pennsylvania accepted the CDC guidelines immediately. Therefore, our parishioners and visitors can freely comply with the relaxed measures with regard to face coverings/masks for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy.

The CDC guidance on the use of face coverings and masks does not allow for an easy observance since they apply differently to different groups of people at the same time— those fully vaccinated and those not vaccinated.

Those who are not fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to wear a face covering or a mask in the nave. If a face covering or mask is worn, it is to be removed before the reception of the Body of Christ at the Communion of the Mass.

At this time, we need to be guided by the principle that people are to be respectful of a person's choice not to wear or to wear a face covering or mask in churches in the Archdiocese.

SEATING

As of May 31, you may take any seat in any pew as we are no longer required to observe social distancing or restrictions on capacity. We do ask everyone to be respectful of those who may wish some spacing while in Church. We have a team of helpers, our Ambassadors, to welcome and greet you as well as to answer any questions you may have.

DURING THE CELEBRATION OF MASS

Missalettes are not available. You are welcome to bring your own missal/readings with you. A WORSHIP AID (*included in the Parish Bulletin*) is available both on-line and for pick up when coming into Church. When leaving, please take this with you.

Presently, there is a cantor and organist at all the Masses. Singing is allowed and encouraged.

As noted above, there is no collection taken up during the Offertory of Mass. Please place your collection envelope into the marked basket as you enter the Church.

There is no Sign of Peace during Mass and the Precious Blood is not distributed.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

The faithful may receive Holy Communion in the hand or on the tongue. We will end the special line for those receiving Holy Communion on the tongue. Please come forward in any Communion line as before in the usual fashion. Those who receive a low-gluten Host are asked to continue to come to the center aisle and up to the Sanctuary where the priest or deacon with the small pyx will be sure that you receive Holy Communion.

When you near the Communion Minister, if you are wearing a mask, please remove your mask. Once the Host has been placed onto your hand or tongue, please move to the side a few feet to receive Our Blessed Lord and replace your mask to return to your pew.

EXITING THE CHURCH

At the conclusion of Mass, please exit the Church through any of the Church doors. Please take the parish bulletin/ worship aid home with you.

FINAL THOUGHTS

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Happy Corpus Christi Sunday! This is the solemn feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is an important celebration as it reminds us of our belief that in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, Jesus Christ becomes truly, really, substantially, and fully present in the Eucharist. It is no longer bread and wine but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Himself.

This belief sets our Communion, our Sacrament apart from the belief and practices of other churches and denominations. We do not have the practice of Inter-communion with other denominations since to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in Holy Communion, involves not only belief in this dogma but also an already existing communion with the Mystical Body of Christ, His Church.

After the 12 Noon Mass, we are having a driving procession of the Blessed Sacrament, a first for our parish family. For those along the pre-planned route, be sure to stand outside of your homes and give witness to Jesus. The procession will end back in the Chapel with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Last week, we provided more information to our parish family via the constant contact/video message, the verbal announcements, and sending materials into your homes about our extraordinary project to repair and repave the parking lot. This is a massive undertaking. The parking lot is almost 30 years old. The deterioration of the lot necessitates this project, but it is so large, it cannot be covered by our annual budgets. We need YOUR financial help to meet this need! We have already raised \$185,053.64 towards this work and ask you to prayerfully consider what you are able to donate. We have included some cement repairs and a new sidewalk from the front of Church to the back lot to enhance the safety and beauty of our parish campus. All told, we are looking to raise \$310,000. Thank you for your commitment and support in this vitally necessary work. If you have any questions, please call me or Linda Coyne at the parish office.

We have joyfully welcomed Mollie Carey, Tracey Fleming, and transitional Deacon Andrew Auletta onto our parish staff. We are grateful to have them as part of our parish team. Mollie is our new full time Communications Director and Tracey is assisting in our PREP program. Deacon Auletta will be with us during his last year of seminary formation in preparation for priestly ordination next May. You'll be seeing each of them around. Be sure to give them a traditional Saint Eleanor welcome. Thanks.




