

Dear Friends,

Happy and blessed Easter!!! "The Lord is truly risen, alleluia! To Him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia!" (entrance Antiphon for Easter Mass).

What joy fills our hearts as we ponder the awesome revelation of Jesus, brutally put to death, rising from the tomb on that first Easter Sunday. This reality impacts

everything in the world, directs our thoughts and our actions. This feast tells us that everything has changed and it has changed forever.

On Easter, our focus also turns to Baptism. At the Easter Vigil, we celebrated the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist) for Natalie Alushi Meta, who now is the newest member of our Catholic parish family. At all the Easter Masses, we renew our own Baptismal promises, reminding ourselves that we are saved through our participation in the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The flowers in Church remind us that just as the earth is renewed through the cycles of nature and life springs forth from the barrenness of winter, so we have life everlasting life, not from ourselves or our works, but in and through death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

As Bishop Robert Barron states, there are three key lessons for us from the disquieting fact of the Resurrection. First, this world is not all that is. Death is not our master. This world is a place of transition to something greater, more splendid and everlasting. Second, the tyrants of this world whether in the realms of the political, nationalism, geographic, academia, or playground "bullies" - know their time is up. The Resurrection is not imaginary; it is real, actual, life-changing. Finally, salvation is open to everyone. Jesus' descent even into 'godforsakenness' reveals the depths of God's desire and the depths of God's love for us as He pursues us in this life.

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not a matter of study, inquiry, memory, 'otherness.' The Resurrection shockingly reveals Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world and we should be unnerved, moved, motivated, changed and set on fire as His disciples here, now and forever.

Are You Called to Be a Deacon? Archdiocese of Philadelphia Minister of the Word · Minister at the Altar · Minister of Charity

While all the baptized are called to share in the mission of Jesus Christ according to the gifts of the Holy Spirit, those who are ordained also offer service in a way proper to the Sacrament of Holy Orders. A deacon's ministry entails proclaiming, preaching and teaching God's Word, assisting the bishop and priest at the Liturgy, assisting at funerals, ministering to the sick and dying, leading the community in prayer and in sacramental liturgies, baptizing, witnessing marriages, and exercising administrative leadership in the Church. A permanent deacon, who may be married, is a member of the clergy and shares in the hierarchy of the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the deacon is configured to Christ the Servant. It is Christ the Servant who acts through the ministry of the deacon.

Montgomery County Science Research Competition For this competition, students designed and conducted an experiment following the Scientific Method. Collegeville's Holy Cross Regional Catholic School was represented at this competition by the following students: sixth graders McKayla Elison, Michael Fiore, Jack Patti, and Ronald Wolfe, as well as seventh graders Holly Binkowski, Jessica Carlini, and Brendan Kenning. Students receiving category awards were Brendan Kenning, 1st place in Environmental Science, and Holy Binkowski, 2nd place in Earth and Space. Both Brendan and Holly will continue on to the next level, representing Holy Cross in the Delaware Valley Science Fair. Two Holy Cross students received special awards for their projects. Holly Binkowski received an award from the Association of Women Scientists. Ronald Wolfe received an award from the Villanova College of Engineering.

PA Junior Academy of Science Competition—students had to plan and conduct a scientific investigation following the Scientific Method. Holy Cross was represented by 7th grade students Holly Binkowski, Jessica Carlini, and Brendan Kenning. Brendan received a second place score for his Ecology project. Jessica received a first place score for her Botany project. Holly received a first place score for her project in the Earth and Space category. Holly and Jessica qualified to compete in the PJAS State Competition which will be held at the Penn State Main Campus, in May.


